We learned that Max would like to be a paleontologist when he grows up as well as a counselor at Camp Wilmot.

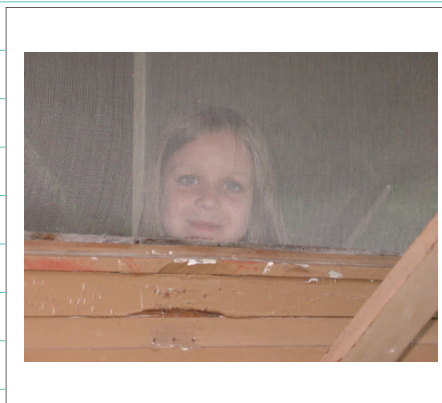
Jess would either like to be an illustrator or a racecar driver. Her favorite sport is basketball and she loves art.
